Starting on 11<sup>th</sup> November, Support Staff from around the country will be engaging with their school communities, MP's and media to raise awareness of the issues Support Staff face due

to poor pay and job insecurity from year to year. New Zealand's school funding system is broken. It fails to deliver certainty for schools, secure and fairly paid work for support staff and consistent, quality learning support for Students. Support Staff are mainly paid from the operations budget which is also used to buy toilet paper. Support Staff are on the frontline of learning support. They are often unable to support themselves and their families on what they earn. 90%

of Teacher Aides are earning less than the living wage and most are in insecure, fixed-term employment. All we are asking is that we are paid the same as similar professions as our pay has

#### Social Media

Mahora School has a number of online platforms which are used for specific purposes. These are:

- School website used to house important information for the community and those interested in learning more about Mahora School. Changes are not made regularly, only when required.
- Facebook used to celebrate achievement through pictures and updates, i.e., sport events, EOTC, camps, etc. Posts are regular and show what's been happening.
- Seesaw used to celebrate and share the learning journey with whanau and friends and communicate with parents of the class. Posts are regular and dependent on how the class uses it.
- SchoolApps (new) used to update the community with school administrative information, i.e., newsletters, upcoming events, reminders, emergency information, sports draws, etc. Updates and notifications are as and when required.

Mahora School now has its very own app! There are many schools and workplaces that are using apps to connect with their communities, and we are excited to be doing this too. As technology advances and evolves, so too does our thinking around what we use and how we use it. The Mahora School app will be used for schoolwide and group notices and notifications. As the user, you can select the 'groups' you'd like to receive notifications for. An example might be; Room 4 (child 1), Softball B, Room 12 (child 2), Rugby A. You will then receive notifications anytime a coach, teacher or administrative person sends a message under that groups heading. The school newsletter will also be available to view online and updated before 3pm every Friday. This will help us as we endeavour to use less paper.



We will still be using our school Facebook page and the class Seesaw pages. We are trying to streamline our online footprint so that each media type has its own purpose. The list above highlights the way each platform is intended to be used. As we transition with the introduction of SchoolApps, certain information may be shared across multiple platforms. It is our intention to

move most admin information to the school app.

To download the app, go to the Google Play or Apple Store, search for SchoolAppsNZ by snApp mobile and download. Once downloaded, use the search function and type in Mahora School. There are a number of features available and we encourage you to use these in the best way that suits. Please subscribe to the alerts you wish to be notified with. It is best not to 'subscribe to all' as you will then receive notifications on everything, including those that your children may not be a part of. To do this simply open the app, click 'Alerts', then tick the alert groups that are relevant to you.
