## COVID-19

We continue to be guided by advice from the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education in the best interests of our children and the wider community.

As a result, we have:

- Cancelled all assemblies and large group meetings until further notice.
- Following notification from sports bodies all Cricket, Hockey, Rugby, Netball, Touch, Mini-ball and Canoe Polo have been cancelled or start dates delayed until further notice.

We have ensured that all toilets have soap and towels, all classrooms hand sanitiser and that all classes have spent time learning about safe hygiene practices. Our cleaning regime around the school is meeting all requirements and there is no suggestion at this stage that we will need to close the School.

We have asked that you ensure we have your up to date contacts and that you have downloaded the SchoolApp. I can't stress enough the **importance** of this. We are communicating schoolwide through Facebook and the app.

School is still an exciting place with teaching and learning continuing. Children are still able to run and stay fit through outdoor exercise and we encourage this in the absence of organised sport.

If your child is not sick, they should come to school. School is a safe place for them and supports a sense of normality. Our best protection remains hand washing, care with sneezing and staying away if sick or if you have contact with those who may have been exposed through international travel.
