Easter and other reminders

There has been some confusion in school communities about Easter Tuesday. The school app post yesterday contained the following. PLEASE make sure you have the school app, as this is where all the information like this is communicated. Not sure how to get it? Call in and we can help you.

- 1. **School is closed on** Friday 2nd April, Monday 5th April <u>and Tuesday 6th April</u>. The reason for this is Friday is Good Friday, Monday is Easter Monday and Tuesday is Easter Tuesday which has been a school holiday since 1954. When schools operated a 3 term year, Easter we deemed a mid term break and it has remained ever since. The time of Easter varies each year and normally the Easter break is during the school holiday time. This year that is not the case due to when Easter is.
- 2. Assembly for next week has been pushed back a week to the final day of term being Friday 16th April. Room 5 will be leading this.
- 3. Term 2 Staff Only Day notice as you know all schools have a series of staff only days to use for further development and training opportunities for staff. These days mean the school is closed. The Board confirmed the Term 2 date at the meeting last night as being <u>Friday 4th June</u>. As usual this is halfway through the term and is the suggested date for our Kāhui (Community of schools) local schools. Monday 7th June is Queen's Birthday, so there is an opportunity for a longer weekend for families able to do this.
