### End of Year - it's now very close!

<u>Reports</u> - End of year reports will be sent home with pupils on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December. Please take the time to sit down with your child/children and read through the report. It's a chance to celebrate the positive learning your child has achieved this year. If you have any queries about your child's report please contact their class teacher.

<u>Accounts</u> - We all have bills...school included! We need these paid before the end of the year please. Our financial year runs from 1 Jan to 31 Dec so really important these are settled. This is particularly important for parents of Y6 students.



<u>Prize-giving</u> - Our school Prize-giving is on <u>Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December</u> at 6pm. Points to note include –

- 1. <u>ALL</u> Mahora children need to attend this event please. It is a school activity. While the main focus is on Y6's, every child will be a Y6 one day and this event is all about being connected and showing whanaungatanga and respect for our students leaving. Please make sure your child is in attendance.
- 2. All Mahora children except Y6's need to be in school uniform please.
- 3. Y6 children wear their smart clothes as they are our school leavers and sit separately.
- 4. The Prize-Giving is held at **Hastings Girls High School** in their hall. There is plenty of parking outside the school.
- 5. All children need to be delivered to the hall side door at the stage end (Pakowhai Road side) by 5.45pm please. Parents and whanau are asked to wait by the ramp area and you will be welcomed in by our tamariki. Can whanau of Y6's please be at the front of the group. We ask that pre-schoolers please remain with parents and do not sit with their brothers and sisters during the prize-giving.
- 6. We will be <u>starting at 6pm</u> so please be on time. We look forward to seeing you all there.

The last day of Term 4 is **Thursday 19**<sup>th</sup> **December and school finishes at 12.00**. All children need collecting at this time.

#### 2020 Start of year information

<u>School Donations</u> – Our Board of Trustees has elected to sign into the new donation scheme being offered to schools in 2020. This will mean there is no voluntary donation asked for in 2020 and the scheme will cover many activities previously charged for. Early next year we will share how this will work and what will be covered while we trial this new scheme.

**2020 Stationery** - We are continuing with pre-packed stationery packs in 2020. All stationery for Mahora children must be purchased through our school office. We do not make any profit from the stationery, we simply pass the cost on. It makes it very simple to come in to school, pay and pick up a pack without having to work through a list in various shops. Pack costs in 2020 will be –

New Entrant (Team 1) - \$35 per child Team 2, 3 & 4 - \$25 per child.

The school office will be open from **Tuesday 28th Jan from 8am-4pm** each day prior to school starting for purchases of stationery and uniform. We do need every Mahora child to have their stationery for day 1 of school. If we were employing a builder and he turned up on day 1 with no tools we know there wouldn't be much building work achieved! The same applies to learning...please ensure your child has their learning tools to start the term on a positive note. Thanks for your support with this.

**2020 Class Connection/ Whanaungatanga Day** – We will be starting the year slightly differently in 2020. On Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> January, all classes will be open from **2pm to 6pm** for families to call in and visit with your child/children. The purpose of this time is for any of the following –

- To explore each child's new learning space for 2020
- To connect with 2020 teachers and staff
- For parents to ask any questions or share important information about their child
- To give our children the opportunity to reduce start of year worries and begin to make strong connections

This time will replace our whānau night meetings usually held in the first few weeks of the year. We encourage you to make the most of this time and make those important connections. Effective learning involves us all working together so we all need to be involved.

Some class numbers have changed for 2020 and I will give you an update on this and other property developments at our prize-giving on Monday night. Due to some last minute staffing changes, we may be able to share class lists sometime next week if time allows. If this doesn't happen they will be displayed on the office windows from Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> January.

I'm sure you can appreciate class placement is a huge job with many factors to be considered. Relationships are key in education and there is so much research and evidence to support this. With our composite classes (e.g. Year 1 & 2, Year 3 & 4, Year 5 & 6) where your child is in the younger year group, the majority of these children will remain with one of their 2019 teachers. So in a Year 1 & 2 class most Year 1's will remain with their 2019 teacher as Year 2's. There are so many benefits to this with relationships already established so learning can kick in straight away. Obviously if teachers move levels, there are staff changes, room movements or combinations that need changes, then there are changes made. We spend considerable time forming classes based on our professional knowledge, experience and understanding of our learners. Thank you for your support of this process. We are always happy to discuss placement decisions with whānau.

#### 2020 Weetbix TRYathlon

This notice is to let you know about an awesome opportunity early in Term 1, 2020

The Weetbix TRYathlon event is open to everyone aged between 6 and 15. Entry options include a *Splash and Dash* for the 6 year olds (no cycle) and either a *Junior Individual TRYathlon* or a *team TRYathlon* which consists of a swim, followed by a cycle and a run, for the older kids. If the children enter as an individual, they complete all three legs of the event or if they enter as a team, they pair up with a friend to form a team of two. As a team, one team member will be the swimmer and the other the cyclist. Both participants will complete the run section together. Children would be welcome to borrow a school bike for this event.

Mahora have created a School group for this event so Whānau can register at home over the Summer break and pay directly to the Weetbix Tryathlon. If you register your child before the **Tuesday 28**<sup>th</sup> **January**, the Early Bird price of \$45.00 will apply. After that there will also be a school group discount but it won't be as good a price as the early bird rate. If your entry is completed before **Tuesday 28th January** your registration pack will be couriered to your home address. If registrations are after that date, race packs will need to picked up on race day. When you register online, it will ask you to select your childs school.
